

President Fote's message - September 2021

Fellow SOBANS,

Greetings. I hope you had a great month of August, and I hope you and your family are staying safe from the COVID-19 pandemic. I just want to take a few minutes and bring you up to speed with what has been happening at SOBA America this past month, and upcoming August plans.

2021 GCE Results - SJC Sasse underperforms

The 2021 GCE Ordinary and Advanced Level results were recently published. Our Alma Mater - SJC Sasse - did not do well. The O'Level results were better than the A'Level results,

In the O'Level, 53 students sat and 45 passed - 84.91%. The 1st student had 9A's, 1B, IC. The 2nd student had 8A's, 2B's and 1 C. Third student 6A's, 4B's 1C.

In the A'Level, 50 students sat and 28 students passed - 56%. The 1st student had 2B's and 2C's. The 2nd student had 1A,



2C's and 1D. The 3rd student had 2C's and 2E's.

As you can see, this is not the kind of result that we expect from SJC Sasse. Consequently, the reaction from SOBANS was one of disappointment. I reached out to the new Principal - Fr. Isaac Anuchem, and the proprietor - His Lordship Bishop Michael Bibi to share the feedback from SOBANS and have a discussion about possible solutions to remedy this situation and return Sasse back to academic excellence.

Both Fr. Anuchem and Bishop Bibi expressed their disappointment at the results. They were very receptive to the suggestions from SOABNS that I shared with them. Bishop Bibi chaired a meeting with the Principal, teachers, the Catholic education secretary, president of the PTA and SOBA Genera President to start the process of doing a root cause analysis and seek solutions.

Some of the issues identified at the meeting and in my conversations with Bishop Bibi include:

1. The displacement of students as a result of the current Anglohone crisis. After the attacks on campus during which students and staff were physically assaulted, the campus was abandoned for about three years. Students were displaced several times and just returned back to campus this past school year. That instability negatively impacted the school in several ways

- A lot of good teachers left as a result of that, as they had no secure employment. Many went to Yaounde and Douala where they found better jobs.
- Enrollment suffered tremendously when students returned on campus as a result of safety concerns some parents still head, despite all the steps taken by Bishop Bibi to renovate the campus and increase security. This led the school to relax on some of its admission criteria as they were trying to get students. Consequently, many students were admitted without proper vetting, including in Forms 5 and Upper sixth.

2.Poor administration and mismanagement: There was an assessment that the previous Principal did not do a good job at managing the school. This led to gross indiscipline by the upper sixth students including poor attendance at classes, illicit drug use, breaking or bounds etc. All these made for a poor learning environment.

3.Lack of adequate resources: The labs were inadequately equipped and students lacked basic textbooks and other resources needed for their education.

Based on this assessment, the following resolutions were taken at the meeting

A:No admission of new students into Forms 4,5 and Upper Sixth

- B. Motivation of teachers
- C. Rigorous selection process for students into Form 1 and Lower Sixth
- D. Introduction of Dormitory Superintendent in all dormitories
- E. Intensify security on campus to prevent students from breaking bounds
- F. Strict checking of students during examinations to avoid cheating
- G. Regular checking of students during classes and study periods
- H. Dormitories to be closed during study periods and keys kept by the Superintendent
- I. Students in examination classes will be strictly followed up

J. The Bishop should be informed regularly on the state of the school so that he can intervene promptly

K. The laboratories and library will be equipped. The heads of the different labs to forward their requisition for approval prior to school resumption.

L. No student from the previous Upper Sixth class will be given a chance to repeat in SJC Sasse

M. Hygiene and sanitation should be a priority. All students will ensure the cleanliness of the dormitories.

N. Students in Form 5 and Upper Sixth will not be actively involved with sports.


During my conversation with Bishop Bibi, I asked him to also work on a strategy for recruiting and retention of good teachers. He assured me that they were taking steps in that front and he has put the Catholic Education Secretary in charge of reviewing their recruitment process.

Bishop Bibi and Father Anuchem have been very open and frank in their communication with me on this matter, as always, and are committed to doing what it takes to turn things around. Please share any thoughts and ideas you have with me so I can continue to be your voice as we work through this matter. In the end, we all have a common goal which is to restore SJC Sasse back to academic excellence.

It is also helpful to show that we are a part of our community, so we can take advantage of the huge funding opportunities available in the non-profit industry, to do big projects in SJC Sasse. 
