POSA and FLOSA Make Their First Official Visit to SOBA UK

Strengthening Global
Brotherhood and Expanding the
SOBA America Footprint

The last weekend of October 2025 will go down in SOBA history as a milestone of unity and international collaboration. On October 25th and 26th, President of SOBA America, Njukang Asong (POSA), and the First Lady of SOBA America (FLOSA) made their first official visit to the SOBA UK Annual Convention, hosted at the elegant Hilton Birmingham



Metropole Hotel—a fitting venue for an event that radiated class, pride, and fraternity.

This two-day gathering brought together over 100 distinguished SOBANS, their families, and guests from across the UK and Europe. It was attended by delegates from SOBA Europe, SOBA Ireland, and SOBA Canada, demonstrating the truly global nature of the Sasse alumni network.

The weekend opened with a vibrant Friday evening “Meet and Greet” reception where alumni, spouses, and friends reconnected after years apart. The atmosphere was filled with laughter, music, and warm embraces as SOBAN brothers shared memories of life in the Sasse hills and updates on their lives abroad. Children played

together, wives bonded, and the evening was a beautiful family reunion across generations.

Saturday began with the Annual General Meeting (AGM), which was attended with great enthusiasm. Discussions revolved around strengthening SOBA UK, supporting Sasse, and improving collaboration among regional organizations.

When the floor was handed to POSA, he was met with a moment of extended applause. In a heartfelt and powerful address, he expressed deep gratitude for the hospitality extended by SOBA UK President Obale, Chairman Nupa, and their executive team. He congratulated them on the successful transition of leadership and praised their resilience in maintaining unity and continuity within SOBA UK. POSA brought warm greetings from Bishop Michael Bibi, Proprietor of St. Joseph’s College Sasse, and highlighted the Bishop’s vision of strengthening SOBA collaboration through the newly established SJC Heritage Board. He urged SOBA UK and other chapters to ensure this board becomes operational, emphasizing the importance of institutional continuity and accountability in managing projects that preserve the legacy of Sasse.

In one of the most significant announcements of his speech, POSA spoke about the Office of Alumni located in Sasse, a visionary project fully initiated and funded by SOBA America. Set to go operational in 2026, this office will act as the official liaison between the Sasse campus and alumni chapters worldwide. It will coordinate project implementation, monitor progress, and ensure sustainability for initiatives like infrastructure upgrades, scholarship management, and mentorship programs.

He invited all regional chapters—SOBA UK, SOBA Europe, SOBA Ireland, and SOBA Cameroon—to partner with SOBA America in making this office a shared institution for all SOBANS globally.

POSA also elaborated on the SOBA America Day, an annual event dedicated to mentoring and inspiring current Sasse students through motivational talks, career guidance, and scholarship awards. He extended an invitation for other regional

chapters and individuals to sponsor awards and scholarships, noting that it would be an enduring symbol of collective commitment to educating the boy child. He also highlighted the new high school project initiated by the Bishop—an expansion that will increase access to Catholic education for more young boys in Cameroon. POSA urged every regional chapter to support this visionary initiative, reminding all that “Sasse’s legacy is not just about our past; it’s our responsibility for the future.”

The weekend climaxed with a glamorous Saturday Night Gala—a stunning event that blended elegance with philanthropy. The theme, “Educating the Boy Child,” inspired attendees to rally behind SOBA UK’s ambitious goal of renovating the Sasse School Library. The décor reflected sophistication—gold, red, white and blue tones representing the Soban spirit—while a live band kept the energy high well into the night.

SOBA America proudly supported the fundraising drive for the library project, further reinforcing its reputation as a leader and partner in international SOBA collaboration. The event closed with SOBANS Singing the Sasse anthem, Sasse Song, group and individual pictures, toasts, dances, and reaffirmed friendship among brothers, many pledging to visit Sasse in December for the SOBA America Day celebration.

Health is wealth—and leadership means caring for one another. That’s the philosophy behind the SOBA Members-at-Large (MAL) Chapter’s bold declaration of November as Prostate Cancer Awareness Month across SOBA America.

Under the stewardship of President Edmund Mbu and the medical expertise of Dr. Felix Oben, the chapter launched an inspiring health campaign designed to educate, engage, and empower men across the Soban community to prioritize preventive health care.

Why Prostate Cancer Awareness Matters

Prostate cancer remains the second most common cancer in men worldwide, with a particularly high prevalence among men of African descent. It often develops silently, without symptoms, until advanced stages—making early detection through screening absolutely critical.

Recognizing the need for awareness in an all-male alumni association, SOBA MAL developed a month-long program that includes:

Educational webinars and live Q&A sessions with medical experts.

Video releases breaking down complex health information into easy-to-understand guidance.

Community-driven health challenges promoting fitness, diet improvement, and routine checkups.

Social media awareness posts and testimonies from SOBANS who have undergone screening and treatment.

POSA praised the initiative, describing it as “a demonstration of real brotherhood—one that protects life, encourages openness, and strengthens our families.” He called upon all regional chapters to organize local health talks and wellness screenings, adding that the wellbeing of SOBANS is the foundation of the organization’s

strength.

As part of this campaign, SOBA America TV will air special segments on men's health, featuring doctors and survivors sharing their experiences. The goal is to normalize health conversations among African men and to ensure that every SOBAN understands that early testing saves lives.





But here's the catch: The deadline to renew and avoid a six-month probation period for key benefits is **August 31st of each year**. Our dues are just \$150 annually, and remember, the SOBA America year starts June 1, so renew early to stay in good standing after the 15-day grace period.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) – Membership, Dues, and Benefits

SOBA America values transparency and member engagement. We understand that navigating dues, membership requirements, and benefits can be complex. Below is a comprehensive list of frequently asked questions to help clarify your rights, responsibilities, and entitlements as a valued member of our community.

1. What are the current membership dues for SOBA America?

Annual dues for standard membership are \$150, which includes a \$50 contribution to the SOBAN Death Benefit Fund. This fund provides a \$10,000 death benefit to the next of kin of a deceased member in good standing. Members may also join the President's Club with a one-time payment of \$1,000. This contribution includes five years of membership dues, with the remainder supporting the SOBA America Scholarship Fund. Flexible payment options are available, including one-time, two, or four installments. Membership dues help fund operations, programs, scholarships, and member benefits.

2. What was the new bylaw change regarding membership adopted at the 2025 Convention?

The 2025 amendment introduced criteria for shareholder eligibility. To qualify, a member must be a former student or teacher of St. Joseph's College, Sasse, residing in the Americas and affiliated with a chapter recognized as being in good standing. A chapter is in good standing if it complies with SOBA America's constitution, submits dues in a timely manner, avoids affiliation with other SOBA bodies, and maintains at least 10 active members. This amendment promotes consistency, accountability, and unity among chapters.

3. What is the significance of the August 31st dues deadline?

Members must renew dues by August 31st each fiscal year to maintain eligibility for financial and bereavement benefits. Members who miss this deadline will be placed on a six-month probation, during which certain financial benefits, including the death benefit, are suspended. Renewing on time ensures uninterrupted access to all benefits. The fiscal year runs from June 1 to May 31.

4. Should I wait until August 31st to pay my dues?

No. Members are encouraged to renew as early as possible, preferably at the start of the fiscal year on June 1. Renewing early ensures continuous coverage and eligibility for all benefits, especially in unforeseen emergencies. Waiting until the last day risks loss of benefits during the grace period.

5. What happens if I'm a new member or didn't renew last year?

New members and those returning after a lapse will be subject to a six-month probation period before financial benefits become active. Additionally, a two-year continuous membership is required before eligibility for the \$10,000 death benefit. This rule is in place to ensure fairness and sustainability of our benefit programs.

6. Are there benefits that do not require a probation period?

Yes. New and returning members immediately gain access to several non-financial benefits, such as participation in the mentorship program, discount programs, professional networking opportunities, chapter-level engagement, leadership training, and access to exclusive content on the member portal.

7. What is the Membership Discount Program?

This program offers SOBA America members exclusive discounts at more than 2,000 U.S. and 450 Canadian businesses. Benefits include savings on automotive services, retail purchases, groceries, school supplies, entertainment, rental cars, travel accommodations, and more. It is one of the most tangible and immediate benefits of membership.

8. How do I access these discounts?

To activate your discount access, register on the official SOBA America website and verify your membership through the Member Portal. Once verified, you can log in, browse categories, search participating businesses, and redeem offers using your digital membership ID.

9. Do I need to be in good standing to receive financial or death benefits?

Yes. You must be current on all dues and any other mandatory financial obligations at the time of the qualifying event. Benefits are only accessible to members in good standing. It's important to maintain timely payments and ensure your chapter remains compliant as well.

10. What bylaw was passed in 2023 regarding death benefit eligibility?

Members must maintain uninterrupted membership for at least two consecutive SOBA America fiscal years to be eligible for the \$10,000 death benefit. Any lapse in membership resets the two-year clock. This amendment ensures the long-term sustainability and fairness of the fund.

11. What does this two-year rule mean practically?

For example, if a member joins on July 1, 2024, and maintains membership without interruption, they will be eligible for the death benefit by July 1, 2026. If dues are missed at any point, they must restart the two-year eligibility period. This rule emphasizes the importance of continuous participation.

12. What is the 2023 Birth Benefit Resolution?

Under this resolution, when a child is born to a SOBANESE (wife of a SOBAN), the SOBA America President will publicly announce the birth. The SOBAN's CashApp, Zelle, or PayPal will be shared with the community to encourage voluntary gifts. The member must be in good standing.

13. Is written notification required for the birth benefit?

Yes. Notification of the birth must be made in writing—ideally via email—to the SOBA America President or designated officer. Verbal notifications or social media posts alone are not sufficient.

14. Where can I find these policies and bylaws?

All official documents, including the SOBA America Constitution, Bylaws, and Policies & Procedures Manual, are available in the secure Member Portal. Registration on the website is required to access this area.

15. What is the 15-day grace period approved in 2024?

Members in good standing at the end of the fiscal year are given a grace period from June 1 to June 15. During this time, they retain access to financial benefits while they finalize renewal. If dues remain unpaid after June 15, benefits are suspended until renewal. Renewal by August 31 avoids a probation period.

16. What are the current convention dues and what does “SOBAN plus Guest” mean?

Convention registration is \$150 for individual members and \$250 for a SOBAN plus one guest—typically the SOBANESE. Additional family members must purchase standard tickets to attend specific events such as the Gala, Cultural Night, or Welcome Dinner.
